**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT FOR THE YEAR
2016-17 & 2017-18 OF THE HARYANA STATE AGRICULTURAL
MARKETING BOARD.**

The Haryana State Agricultural Marketing Board has been constituted under section 3 of The Punjab Agriculture Produce Markets Act, 1961. It consists of a Chairman and a Chief Administrator who is in the rank of a Head of the Department and maximum eleven other members of whom four shall be official and seven can be non-official members. During 2016-17 & 2017-18 the following were the members of the Board:-

During 2015-16 the Board meeting were held on 10.06.2015, 09.09.2015 21.12.2015 & 9.3.2016 and 96 resolutions were passed.

The working of Board is divided into four wings, namely (i) Construction Wing headed by the Engineer-in-Chief assisted by 2 Chief Engineers, 7 Superintending Engineers, 26 Executive Engineers, 1 Architect and 88 Sub Divisional Engineers along with other supporting staff. The Enforcement Wing is headed by the Chief Marketing Enforcement Officer assisted by the Marketing Development Officer/Zonal Administrators/ Zonal Marketing Enforcement Officers/ Distt. Marketing Enforcement Officers. The Accounts Wing is headed by the Controller of Finance and Accounts assisted by the

Senior Accounts Officer, Accounts Officers and Sectional Officers along with other supporting staff. The Administrative Wing is headed by the Secretary Board assisted by Administrative Officers and other supporting staff. The Chief Administrator enjoys the powers of Head of the Department. The Secretary Board enjoys the powers of the Head of the office.

Cases of all wings are put up to the Chief Administrator for final orders where he is competent and wherever the decision of the Chairman of the Board is needed, the files are put up to the Chairman of the Board for his final orders through the Chief Administrator.

The sanctioned staff strength during the year 2016-2017 was 3314 out of which 2267 were in position. Out of these, 48 were Class-I, 219 were Class-II, 1740 were Class-III, 260 were Class-IV and the year 2017-2018 was 3314 out of which 2244 were in position. Out of these, 48 were Class-I, 219 were Class-II, 1731 were Class-III, 246 were Class-IV. The position of staff during the year 2016-2017 & 2017-18 is as under:-

Planning and Development.

Planning and development wing of the Board assesses demands and requirements for the development of mandis as well as providing additional facilities in the existing mandis. It is on the basis of this assessment that the Board directs a Market Committee from time to time to establish markets with the approval of the State Government and also provide basic facilities for

farmers and persons visiting these mandis in connection with sale, purchase, storage and processing of agricultural produce.

In the year 2017-2018, the total number of markets were 476 (list attached). The Board has constructed 90 food storage godowns having capacity of 418934 M.T. Board received Rs. 1 crore 26 lakh as rent from these godowns *during 2017-2018*.

Development works.

As provided under section 26 of the Act, the funds of the Board shall be expended for acquisition of land of Market Committees, maintenance and improvement of the markets, construction and repairs of buildings which are necessary for the purposes of the market and for the health, convenience and safety of the persons using it providing comforts and facilities such as shelter, sheds, parking accommodation and water, on constructions and repairs of approach roads, culverts, bridges and other purposes.

Enforcement Branch.

For the Enforcement of the provisions of the HAPM Act, Rules and Bye-laws, the Board has created enforcement staff consisting of Chief Marketing Enforcement Officers at Head Quarter and Zonal Marketing Enforcement

Officers at Hisar, Gurgaon and Ambala who are assisted by the Distt. Marketing Enforcement Officers. In Market Committees the following staff is working :-

During the year 2016-2017 there were 34294 licenses working under the Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets Act, 1961 in Haryana State In the and 34322 license in the year 2017-2018 The Head wise total income received by Market Committees from Agricultural produce brought in the mandis is shown in the Annexure 'A' and 'B'

During the year 2016-2017, Zonal Administrators, Zonal Marketing Enforcement Officer, Distt. Marketing Enforcement Officer detected the evasion of Market fee, HRDF, Composition fee and penalty to the tune of Rs. 42 lakhs and Rs. 41 lakhs in the year 2017-2018 respectively on account of checking of dealers.

Accounts Branch.

- (i) As provided under section 25 of the Act all receipts of the Board are credited to a fund called Marketing Development Fund which is operated by the Chief Administrator/Secretary of the Board along with Controller, Finance & Accounts/Accounts Officer of the Board as authorized by the Board. The main income is received by a Committee from market fee/ licence fee.**
- (ii) The Market Committee collects fee from the buyers and remit 30% to the Board. Besides this, the Board also receives considerable income from interest on loan recoverable from Market Committees, other institutions, employees of the Board and rent of storage godowns.**

During the year 2015-2016 a sum of Rs 100.55 Lakh respectively was granted as loan to the employees of the Board on account of House Building Loan, Conveyance Loan, Marriage Loan and Computer Loan. The financial position of the Board in 2016-17 and 2017- 2018 was as under :-
