

BBY SCHEME DESCRIPTION OF PARTIAL COMPENSATION PLAN:

A unique scheme by the State Govt. to compensate the Horticultural Growers for the production of low prices of their produce in Mandi.

The main objectives of the scheme:

- Reduce the risk by the fixed protective price of the farmers during the low cost of vegetable and fruit in Mandi.
- Encourage farmers for diversification in agriculture.

In the first phase, the crops covered under the scheme, protected prices and fixed production

- Four Crops: Tomatoes, Onions, Potatoes and Cauliflower
- Protective price of fixed crops and Benchmark yield.

Main features of the scheme:

1. To free the risk of vegetable cultivators.
2. To assure Rs. 48000 - Rs. 56000 per acre income on the above 4 crops.
3. To fix the protective price for four vegetables (tomatoes, onions, potatoes and cauliflower).
4. Registered farmers to get benefits through BBY portal upto protective price on the sale of vegetables at lower prices within the stipulated period.

5. The benefits of this scheme are eligible for land owners, leaseholders or tenants.

Registration process for the benefit under the scheme:

- To avail the benefits under this scheme, the farmer must register on the BBY portal of the HSAM Board during the settlement period.
- Field certification of registered farmers by the Horticulture department.
- Provision for filing an appeal by the farmer after being dissatisfied with the certified area.
- Free registration of farmers.
- Registration will remain open only during the stipulated period.
- Registration facility will be available on the e-Disha centers and websites of Horticulture Department and Marketing Board.
- Determination of registration, verification, appeal and sale period:
 - Registration will be valid only in the period shown in the table below.
 - Verification and Appeal will be in the period shown in the table below.
 - Incentives are valid during the sales period shown in the table below.

Promotion Process:

- Sale on J-Form will be mandatory.
- After sale on J-Form, the sale details will be uploaded on the e-portal, for which provisions will be available in the offices of each concerned Market Committee.
- During the sale period, if the wholesale price of crop production is less than the protective price, then the farmers will be eligible to compensate for the difference in prices.
- The incentive amount will be released within 15 days of the sale of the farmer's linked link bank account.
- The average daily wholesale price will be determined on the basis of the daily rates of the mandi identified by the Mandi Board.

Planning Assessment:

- For the effective implementation of the scheme, State level Committee headed by Chief Secretary and District level Committees headed by concerned Deputy Commissioner will assess the scheme from time to time.
- Extensive publicity of the scheme through newspapers, digital facilities, seminars and farmers' conferences
- Provision of sufficient funds for the scheme.
